Goal statement:

Students who complete the Humanities requirement of the Core Curriculum program at Rosemont College will have investigated the broad themes and issues of the human condition that cut across time and place. By exploring the major philosophical, historical, artistic, and literary movements of world cultures, students will have compared the ideas, emotions, and experiences of others with those of their own in an investigation of the interconnectedness of the human experience. The ultimate goal is to instill in students the ability to apply and utilize that knowledge in their daily lives in new and appropriate ways.

Objectives:

- Students will identify human values as demonstrated through critical reflection of the written, verbal, or performance arts.
- Students will articulate underlying premises in movements or periods in time and the ideas that shape them.
- Students will compare diverse perspectives across cultures, present and past.
- Students will use appropriate information technologies to conduct research.
