Goal statement:

Students who complete the Catholic Theology requirement of the Core Curriculum program at Rosemont College will formally engage the Catholic "roots" of Rosemont College, as articulated in the College mission statement. Students will explore key elements of Scripture and Tradition that have formed and continue to form the Catholic Church as an institution, which continue to impact the greater world. Students will engage the Catholic social justice tradition and explore contemporary issues of social justice. This will prepare students to be engaged citizens of the work.
